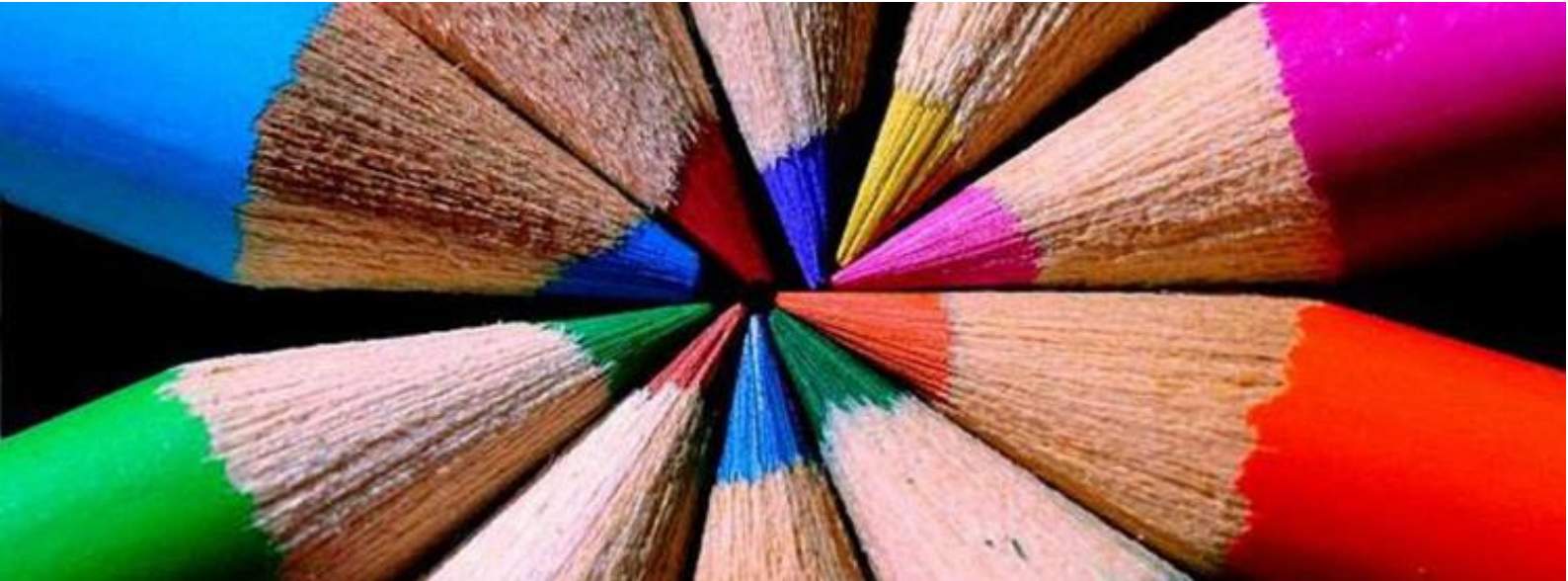

Raising Awareness about the Situation of Newly Arrived Migrants

In the [Cultural Diversity in your Classroom](#) course, we explore how to become an intercultural competent teacher and how to develop your students' intercultural competence. We look at why it is important to explore cultural diversity in schools, what different models of cultural diverse societies there are and how that plays a role in schools. We will develop methods to work with students who do not speak the language of instruction very well, identify ways on how to build a sense of belonging and identity in your class and reflect on how you develop empathy and open-mindedness.

The course is part of a 3-course series exploring the topic of cultural diversity, the situation of newly arrived migrants in general and how to integrate newly arrived migrant students in schools and classrooms. The courses are relevant to any teacher working in a culturally diverse environment or interested in developing students' cultural awareness and expression. **If all three courses as part of the series are completed within two calendar years, a special certificate and recognition is awarded on top of the individual course certificates.**
